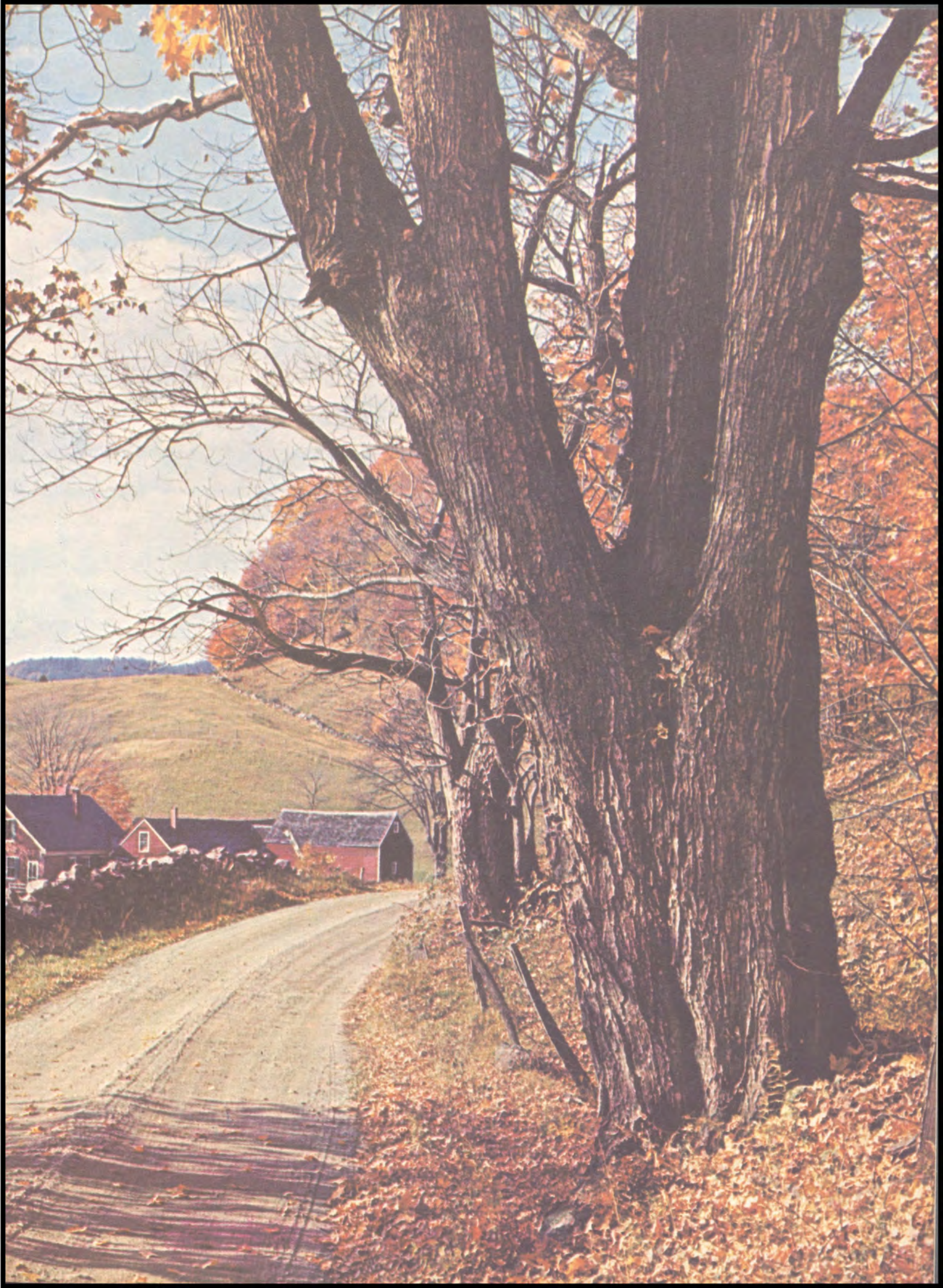


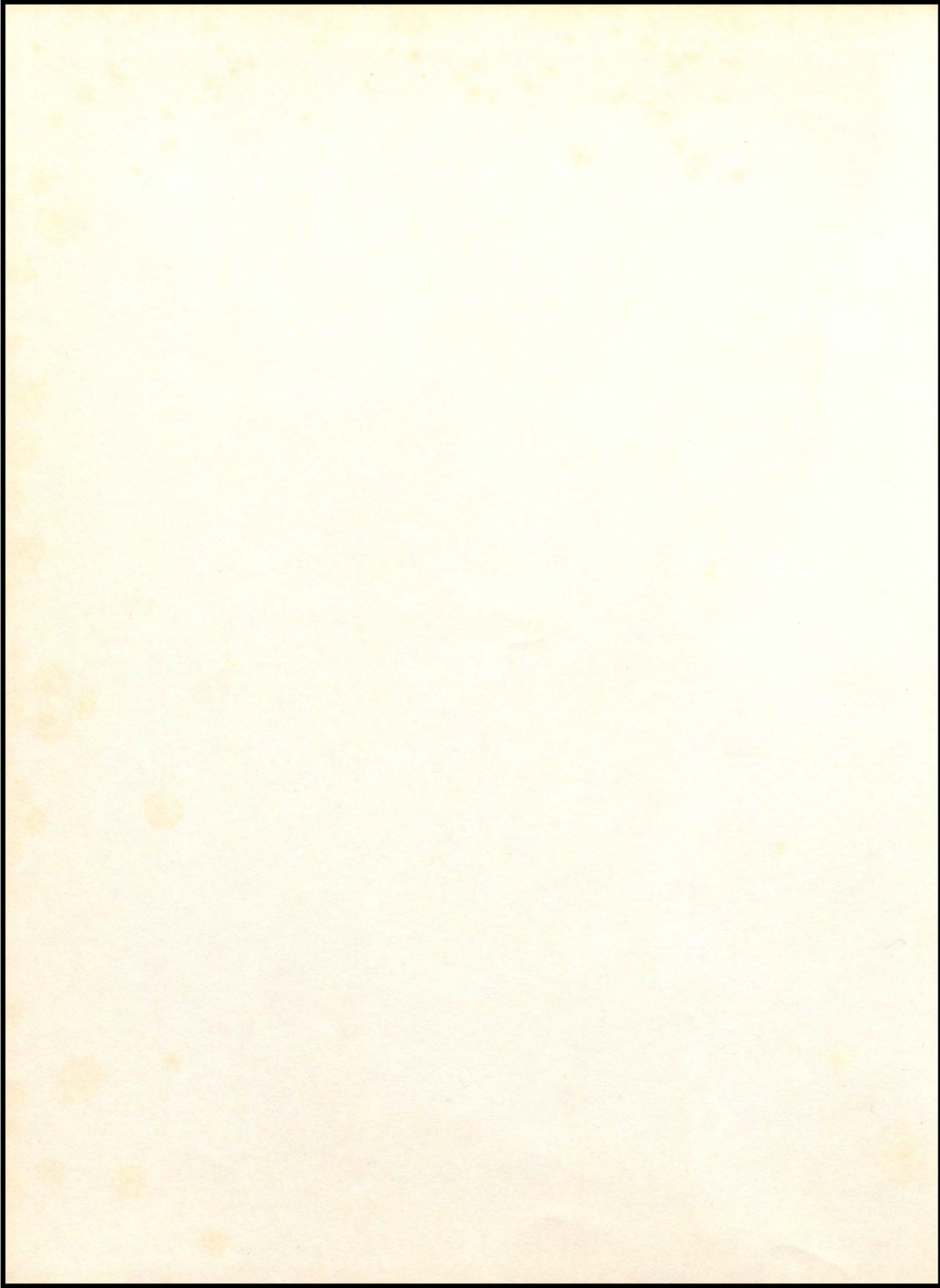

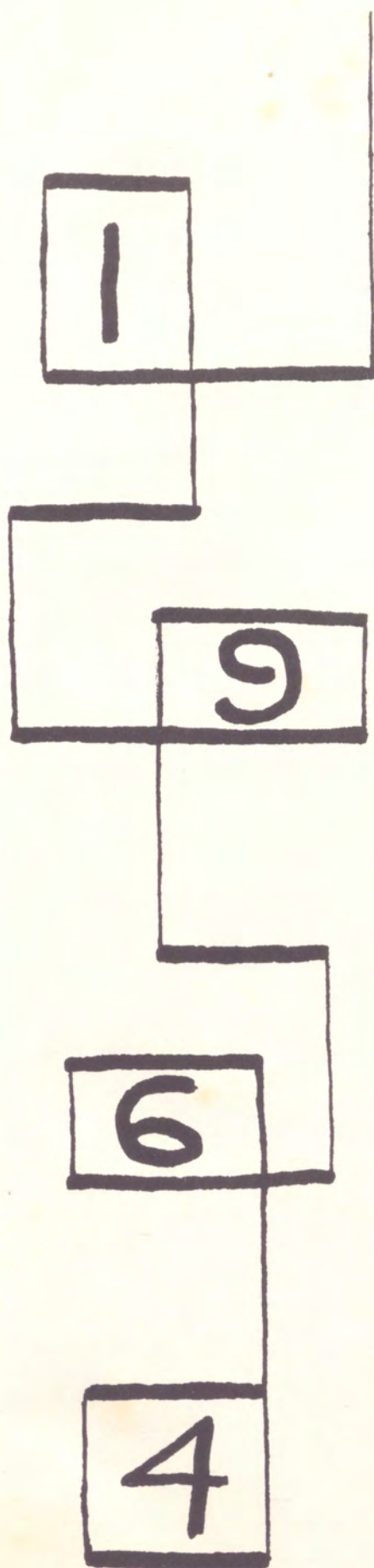

Dedication

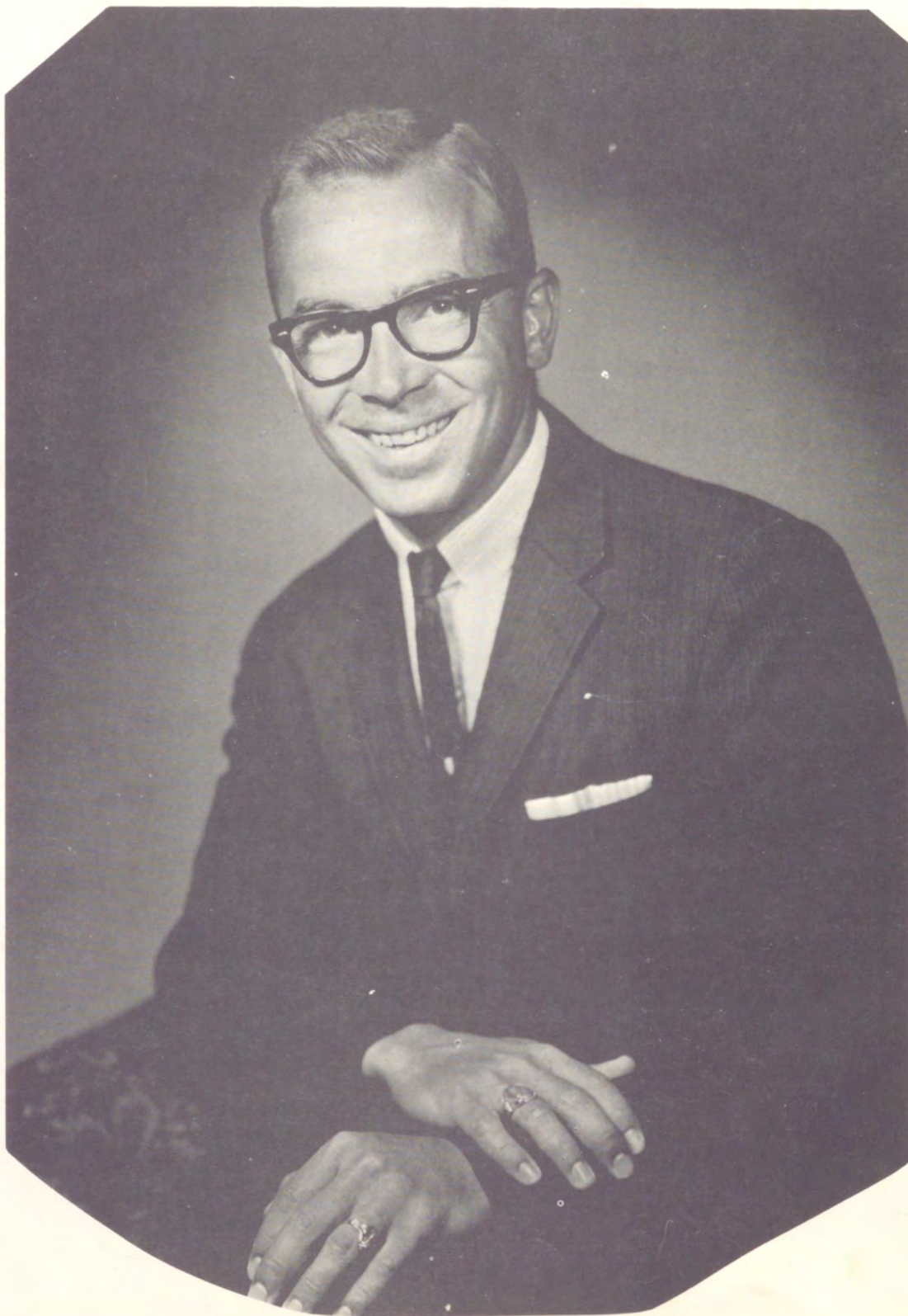
We, the Class of 1964 of the Corry Area High School, dedicate this Corrian to Mr. Max L. Bennink.

His qualities of friendliness, loyalty, and sportsmanship have won a place of high respect, deep admiration, and warm affection in the hearts of the student body and the faculty.



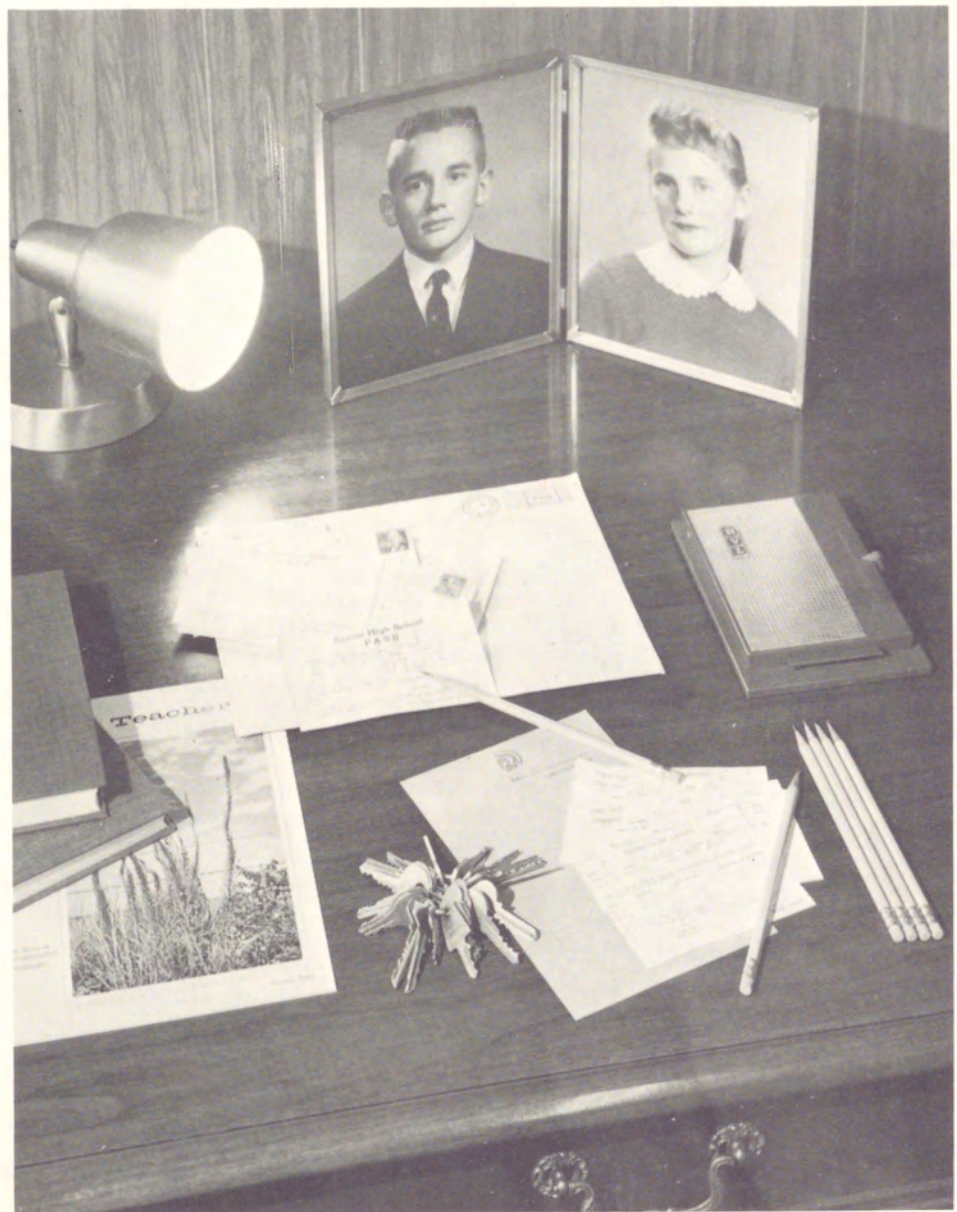
