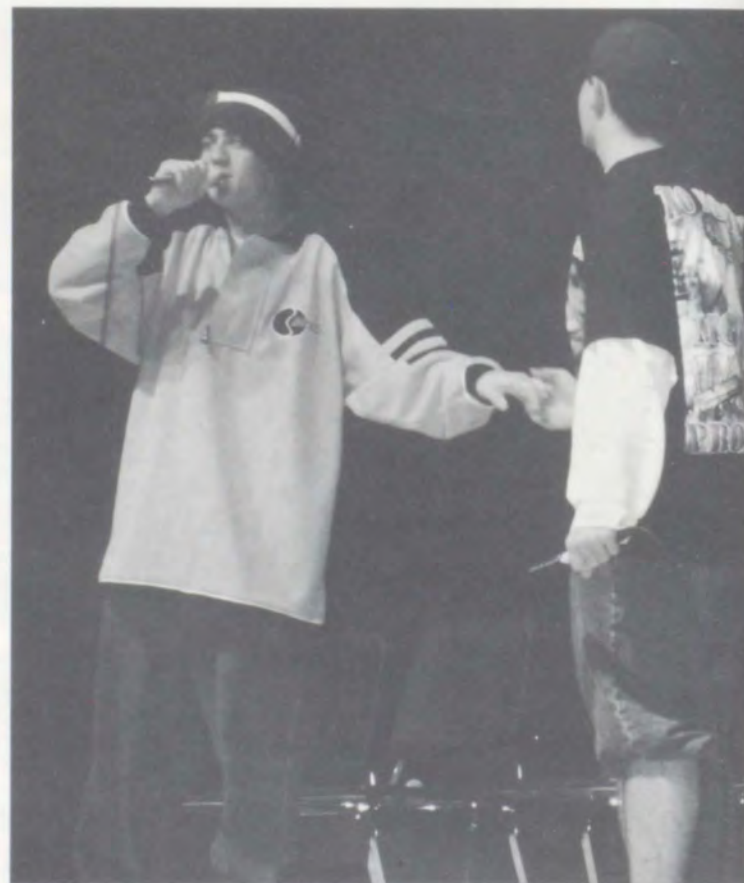


The Psych and Soc Program

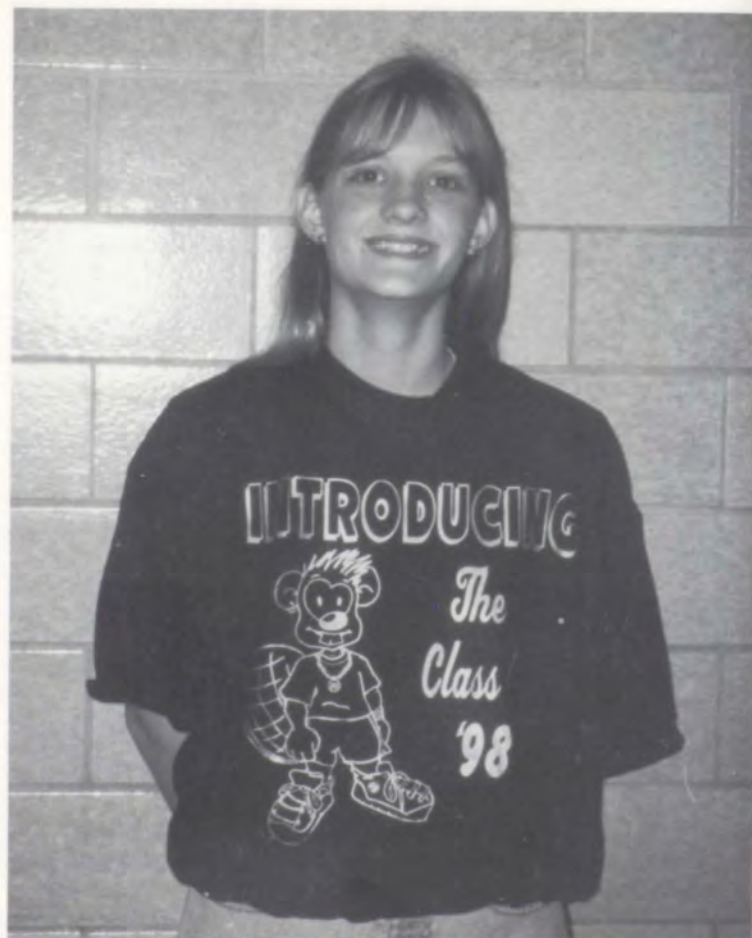

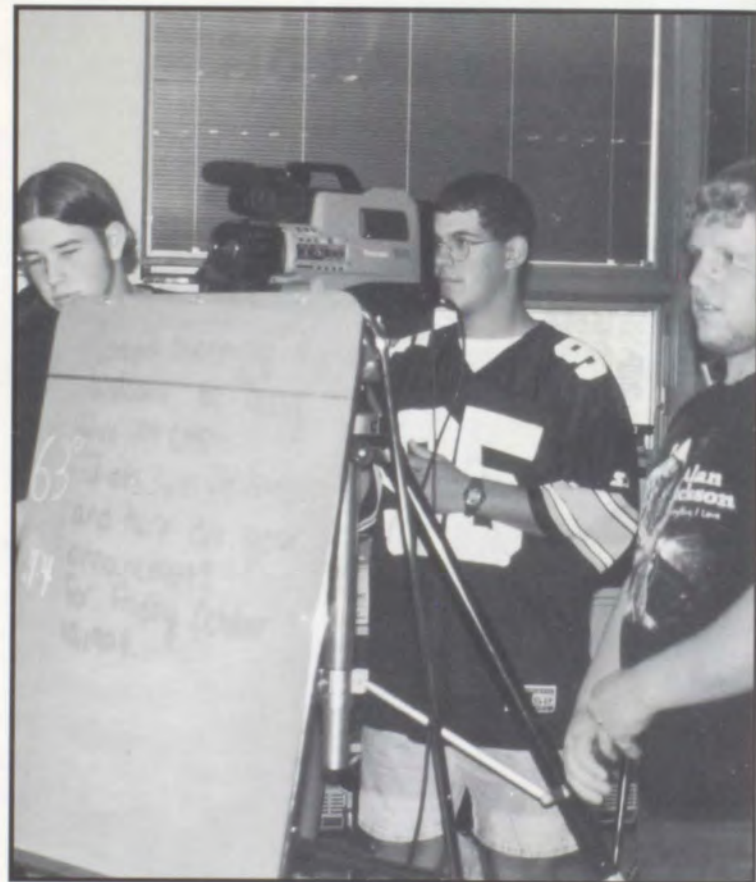

Ryan dresses like a real news anchor, as the class tries to emulate a real television newscast. Eric, a tech, stands on the side waiting for his cue to pull the mic.

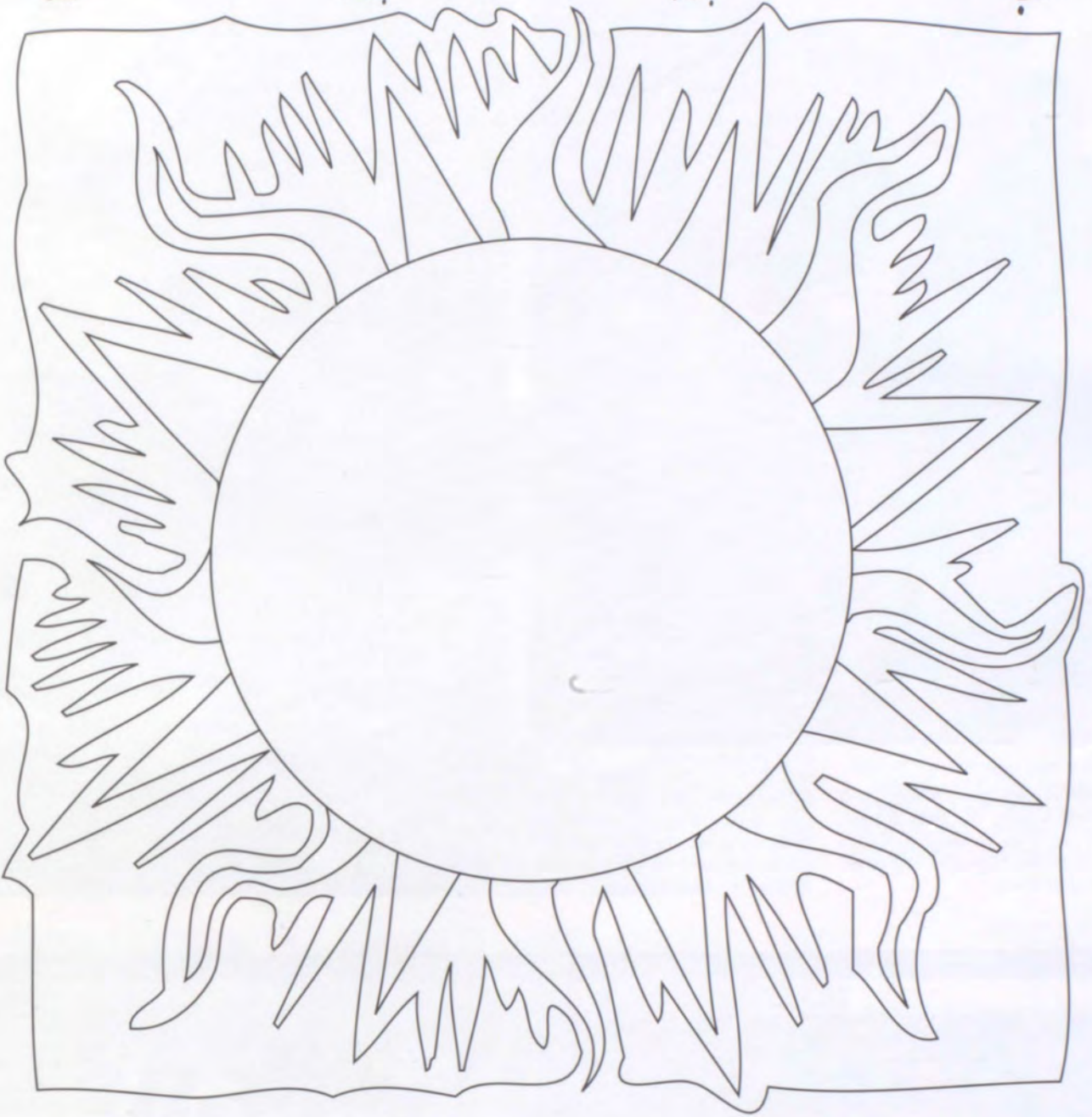

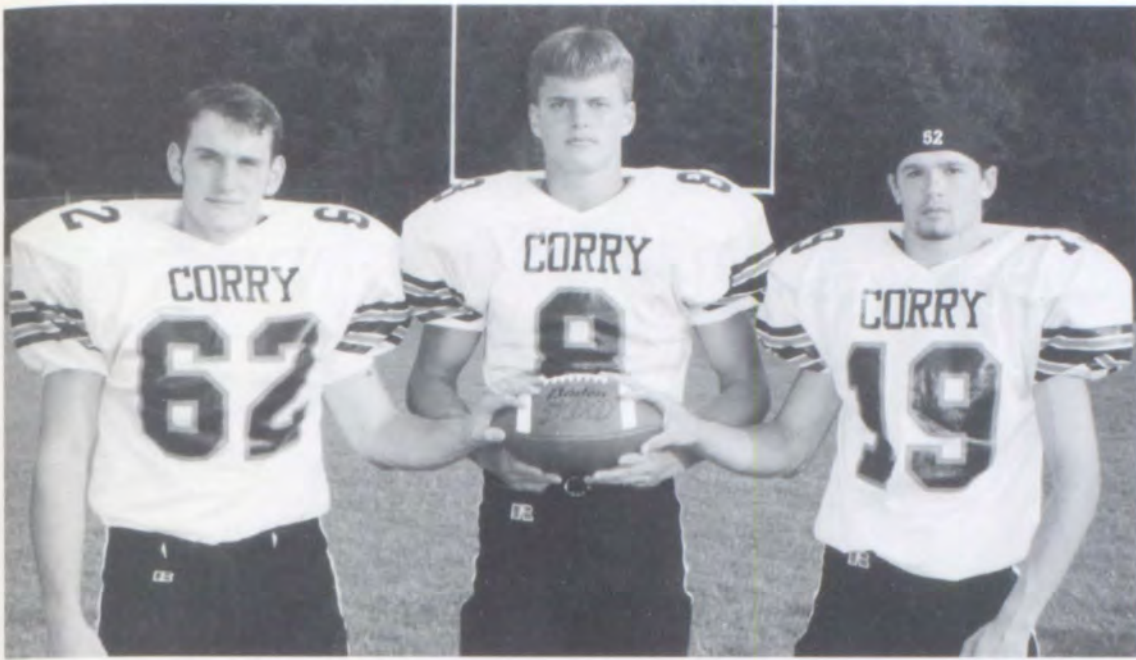

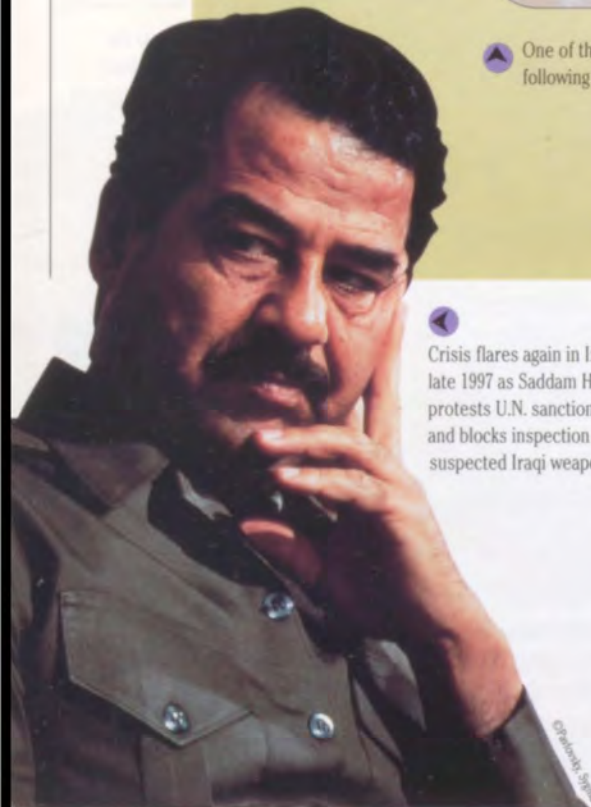

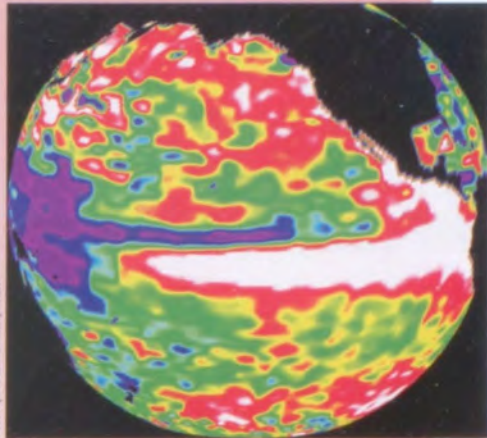
