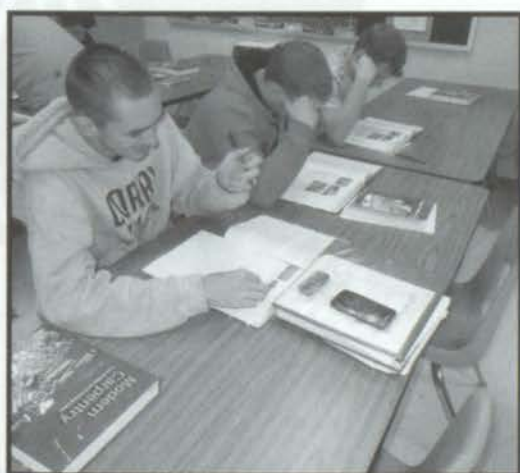

Cosmetology

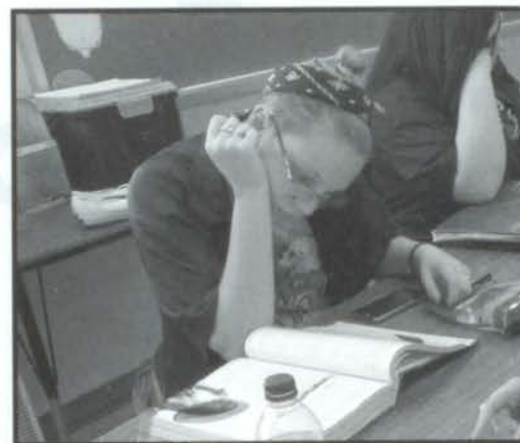

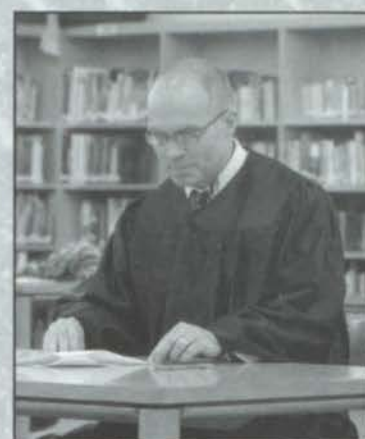




Criminal Justice

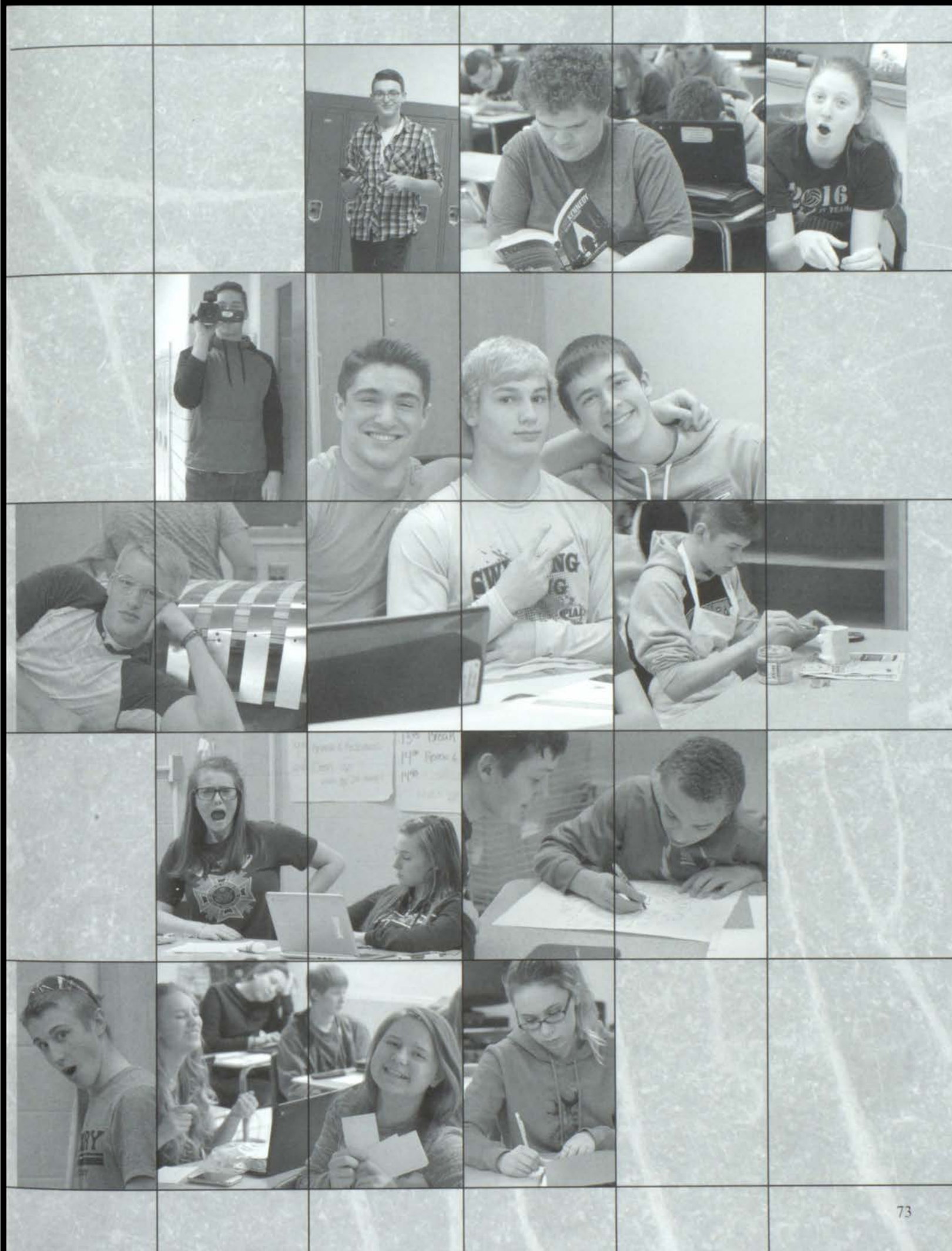
