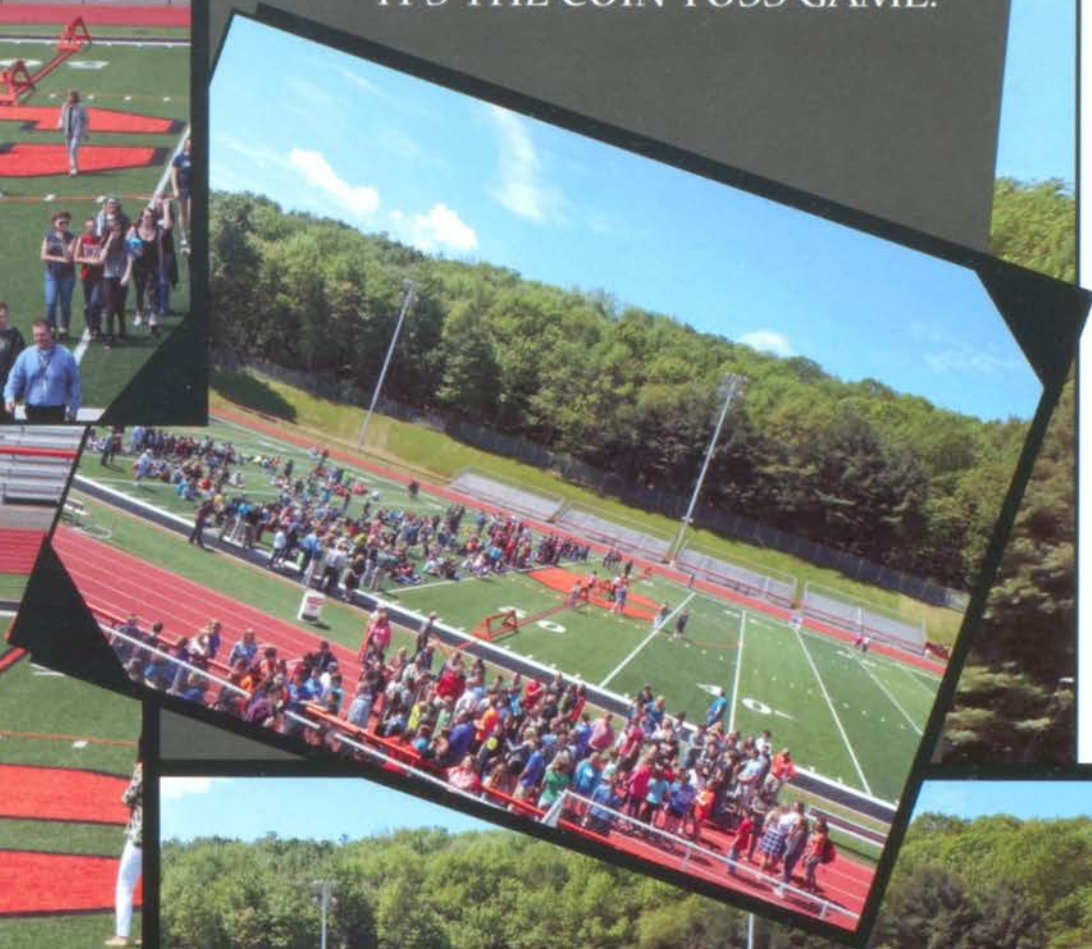

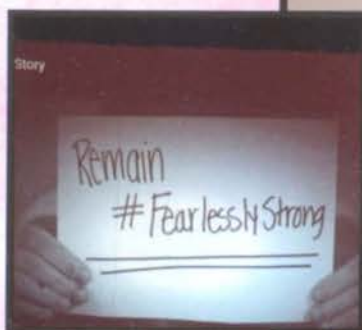
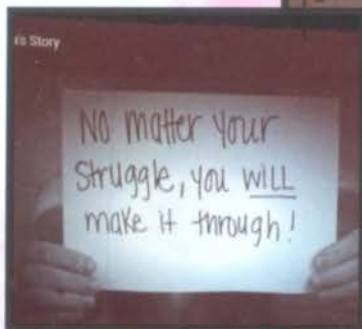


Community

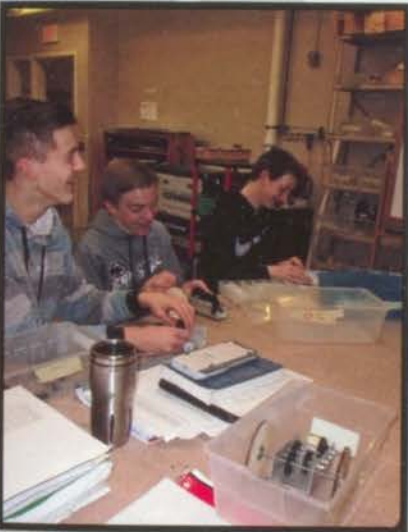
#S.T.E.M

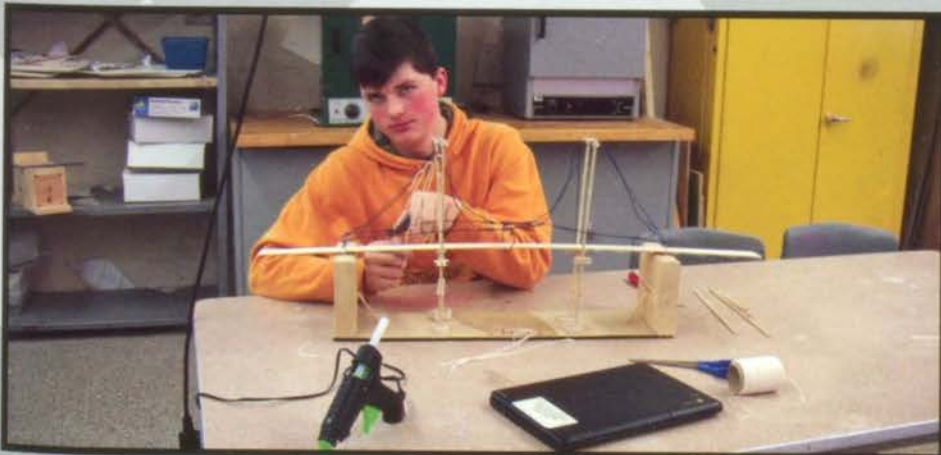

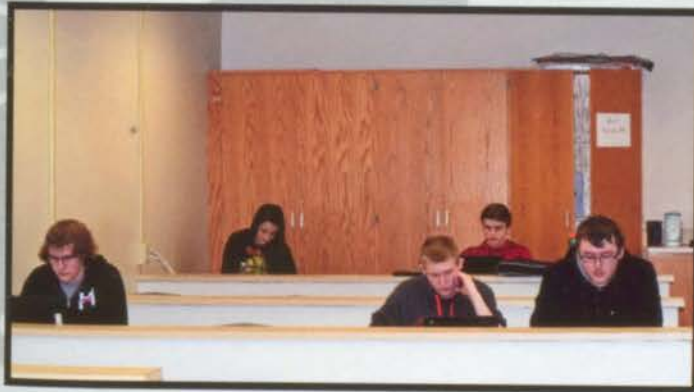
#Business

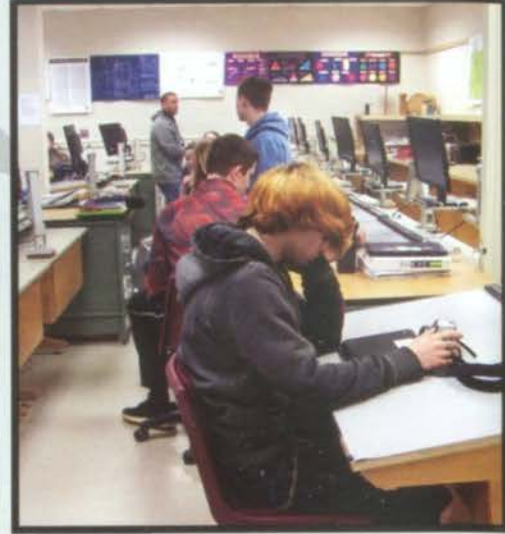

#Computer Aided Drafting

Computer Aided Drafting is a class that teaches students how to use computer programs such as Solid Edge. In this class, students learn how to do parametric modeling, design optics to manufacture, do multi-view projections, learn sectional views, create auxiliary views, and dimensional drawings. In architectural drawing, students will study the principles of design, plan and design a residence, evaluate home design, and prepare a set of house plans.
