The judges found a great variety of flavor options including: classic chicken noodle, creamy chicken noodle, creamy loaded potato chowder, pasta e fagioli, tortellini & collard greens, Maruchan® Ramen noodle, broccoli & cheese, tortellini with vegetables & ham, and winter squash. The competition was stiff and the judges were tough, but the Golden Ladle landed fairly into Lisa Kunselman's very capable culinary hands! ### Ingredients:

- 2 sticks butter
- 2 Tbsp. garlic, minced
- 1 medium onion, diced
- ½ cup flour
- 2-3 carrots, grated or diced

- 2 tubs Knorr® chicken stock dissolved in 1½ cups milk
- 10-12 small potatoes (red, yellow, or Yukon), diced
- 3 cups milk (hot)
- 4 Tbsp. olive oil
- 16 oz. bag frozen corn
- 6 oz. pkg. real bacon crumbles
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 2 cups heavy cream
- Grated cheddar cheese for garnish

### Instructions:

Melt butter in large pot over medium heat. Add garlic, onions and carrots and sauté 5-7 min. until tender. Whisk in flour, cook another 2 minutes. Slowly add dissolved chicken stock. Add potatoes and additional 3 cups milk. Cook over medium-low heat approximately 20-30 minutes.

In medium skillet, heat olive oil, corn and bacon. Add salt and pepper. Sauté 10 minutes. When potatoes are fork tender, add corn mixture and heavy cream. Reduce heat to low and cook an additional 10 minutes. Serve and top with grated cheddar cheese.

Taste. Each entry could score a possible 120 points and the final scores ranged from 59 to 88 total points. After the official judging was complete, team members and other residents were able to enjoy the soup and agreed they were ALL WINNERS!

## Policy on gifts and gratuities

While residents, clients and family members often wish to show their appreciation for the care and services rendered by St. Paul's staff, St. Paul's must ensure that residents, clients and family members do not feel obligated to give St. Paul's or its staff gifts or gratuities in order to assure a resident or client receives quality care. In order to comply with this policy St. Paul's has set forth the following guidelines:

1. Employees may not ask or suggest that a resident or client, or any person acting on behalf of a resident or client should offer or give gifts or gratuities to St. Paul's staff.
2. Employees may not accept cash or currency of any kind, including but not limited to tips from any source or individual. Employee bonuses and/or gifts provided by St. Paul's do not constitute gifts or gratuities.
3. Employees may only accept non-cash gifts that do not exceed \$10.00, and/or are shared by the whole staff. In order to be considered a non-cash gift, the gift cannot be converted to currency.

## Opportunities for Gifts of Appreciation to Staff

Many residents, clients and families often ask how they can give back and say "Thank You" to the staff who have provided excellent care to their loved ones while living at St. Paul's. These three funds give you the opportunity to do so:

1. A donation may be made to the Staff Appreciation Fund. This fund enables St. Paul's to recognize all staff. (i.e., to provide staff apparel, staff appreciation picnics, or gift cards for various occasions.)
2. A donation can be made to the Staff Education Fund. You can define the education opportunity or leave it to the administrator's discretion.
3. A donation of appreciation can be made to the Annual Staff Christmas Celebration. This donation can be given to the administrator or director and identified for the Staff Christmas Celebration and will be used to offset the cost and for staff gifts the night of the party.

If you would like to make a donation to staff for anything outside of these three funds, please see your administrator or director to talk about specifics.

***Employees may not accept individual gifts, cash or currency of any kind from a resident or family member. We appreciate your support of these guidelines in order for us to remain compliant with regulations and our corporate compliance policies.***

## Message from Pastor Julia

*I bind unto myself today  
the power of God to hold and lead,  
his eye to watch, his might to stay,  
his ear to hearken to my need,  
the wisdom of my God to teach,  
his hand to guide, his shield to ward,  
the Word of God to give me speech,  
his heavenly host to be my guard.*

These words—in my opinion, among the most beautiful in all of Christendom—come from a prayer attributed to St. Patrick, evangelist to Ireland in the early 5th century. With them, Patrick invited the Irish into a faith relationship with God which promised his protection, direction, care, and goodness day by day. Such a promise would have been welcome in this rough and turbulent era when hunger, illness, battle and death via any or all of them was a constant threat in life and people often felt defenseless and alone.

Human civilization is more advanced 1800 years later and yet the world's people are still challenged by poverty, sickness, and war and in need of divine help and safe-keeping. This prayer of St. Patrick continues to invite God's own into closer relationship with him and into a faith which brings confidence and hope in the midst of all that comes our way.
