Dear Friends of St. Paul's,

In the wake of the pandemic, we knew 2022 would be a year of rebuilding at St. Paul's. So many things had changed over the last two years that we needed to regroup, return to our foundation, and start building anew.

That is why the theme of our 2022 Impact Report is "Building Blocks for Success." St. Paul's wouldn't have made it through the last 155 years since our founding, let alone a pandemic, without the core building blocks for success – our mission, vision and values.

St. Paul's mission is to provide meaning, richness of life, health care, and other support services, while maintaining and enhancing the dignity of human life – regardless of an individual's financial resources.

That mission is possible because of the many donors, volunteers and team members highlighted in these pages, who are helping us to recover and rebuild.

Throughout 2022, there were 400+ team members who held the figurative brooms, lights and other tools as we swept the dust off our building blocks and began to reshape and rebuild. Every single day they showed up and worked hard to provide the very best care to our residents.

Our team was supported by almost 900 donors behind them, who gave financially to fill in the gaps for benevolent care, resident life enrichment and other funds at St. Paul's. Some of these donors rallied behind actual construction projects like the Keifer Building renovation (see pg. 6) and the upcoming bridge project (see pg. 8), giving of their

resources to help build new improvements at St. Paul's. I hope you enjoy reading about the successes you made possible through your support of the residents and team members at St. Paul's.

In 2022, we continued to work on expanding our volunteer program with 118 volunteers actively serving. St. Paul's volunteers help with the building blocks for physical and emotional wellbeing for our residents. They assist residents in connecting with others, getting to appointments that are important to them, exercising their skills, and learning new things. 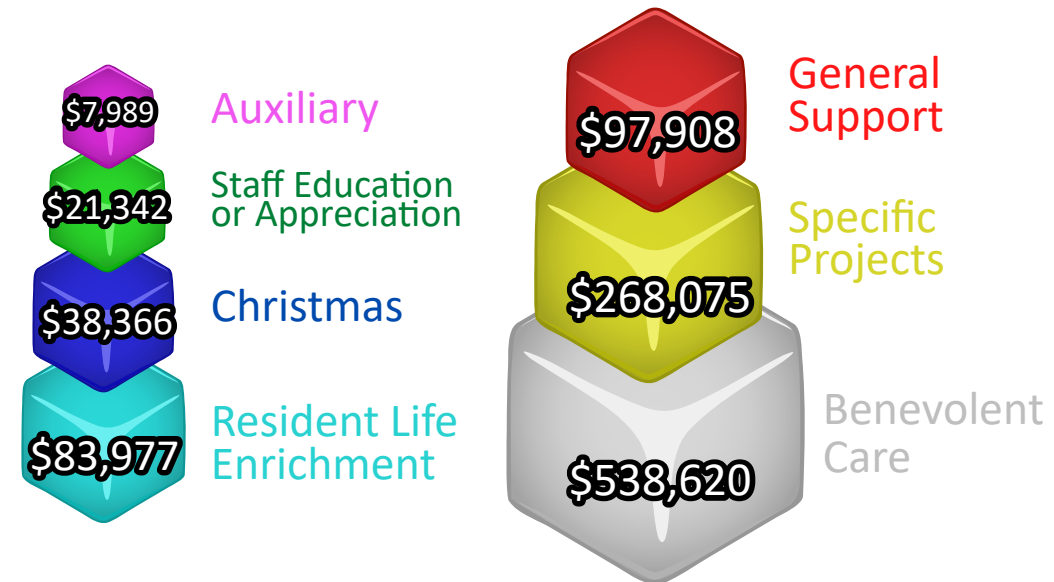

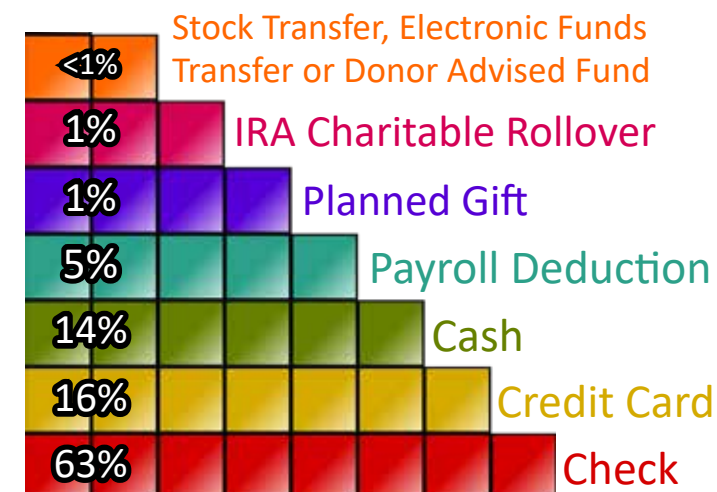

OLD Becomes New

The Keifer Building is the oldest on St. Paul's campus. Originally built in 1908 to serve as an administrative building, schoolhouse and chapel for the orphanage, the beautiful, brick colonial-style building has now stood through more than a century of growth and changes at St. Paul's.

Today the Keifer Building is a community center for residents of The Colony, St. Paul's independent living neighborhood. It also houses the administrative offices for The Colony, Without Walls and St. Paul's Marketing and Charitable Giving Departments.

In 2019, St. Paul's board of directors began discussing in earnest the need to renovate in order to maintain and preserve the historical building, as well as to meet the current and future needs of the residents and staff.

The renovation work began in 2021 and will wrap up in 2023. As part of the project, St. Paul's offered four naming opportunities to donors in order to assist with the furnishing of the new community spaces that would be created.

All four naming opportunities were reserved by donors, and renovations on those spaces were completed in 2022.

The large new community room, which was the site of the former chapel for the orphanage, has been named **Wallace Commons** in memory of Colony residents Archie & Ellen Wallace, who generously included a planned gift for St. Paul's in their estate plan.

A new dining area, which was the original dining room for the orphanage and The Cornerstone Restaurant from 2015 - 2018, is now named **The 19th Hole**. This space was donated by Colony resident Margie Hays in memory of her husband B.H. "Bob" Hays.



The 19th Hole

Bob was a retired Air Force veteran and spent the remainder of his career as a banking manager. He was also

ordained and served as a part-time chaplain for Meadville Hospital for several years.

In 2007 Bob was diagnosed with vascular dementia. From there began a 15 year journey with the disease, through which Margie was right by his side.

They moved to The Colony in 2016 where they would have more support as his illness progressed. By April 2018, Bob needed memory care and moved into Jones Serenity Circle at The Heritage where he lived until his passing in January 2022.

2 Corinthians 4:16 says "Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every day." Margie saw this truth with Bob. Even when he could no longer remember who she was, his gentle, generous and loving nature remained intact.

Margie chose to name The 19th Hole in memory of Bob to honor his courageous battle with dementia; his dedication to his country, his family and the Lord; and his love for the game of golf.

"I want The 19th Hole to be a place for friendship, fellowship, family celebrations and enjoying good food. All things that were important to Bob," she said.

The 19th Hole is just that, serving as the site for resident potluck dinners, birthday parties, holiday celebrations and more.

"I thank St. Paul's for the blessed opportunity to remember Bob who helped many during his God-given days on this earth," said Margie. "I wanted to honor a great man, who desired to serve his country and mankind at the age of 17 and did so for 95 plus years."

Just across the hall from The 19th Hole are the new library/lounge and a multi-purpose room, which were both named by Colony resident Gerry McElree.

Place is the site of two former administrative offices for St. Paul's Without Walls. The remodeled space features beautiful woodwork, a fireplace, a self-serve coffee and wine bar, and tables for playing games or meetings.

"I'd like people to feel comfortable going in there, having a cup of coffee, meeting up with people," said Gerry. "I wanted to provide an opportunity for people to gather spontaneously."

Another unique feature of the room is the wall decor, which is a rotating display of artwork created by Colony residents.

Gerry thinks Frank would have liked the space. Friendship and community were very important to him.

Frank was a physician and general surgeon who practiced in Greenville from 1955 - 1999. He was also

"I liked the concept for those two rooms," said Gerry. "I just really liked the idea of having some more intimate, comfortable spaces where people could gather in small groups."

very involved in the Greenville community throughout his life, active in the First Presbyterian Church and serving on several nonprofit boards including the United Way and the Greenville Historical Society, to name just a

few. Frank & Gerry moved into The Colony in 2011, and Frank passed away in March 2013.

"I wanted to recognize both Frank and my parents with this gift because I wouldn't have been able to make it without each of them," said Gerry.

Like The Gathering Place, the new Library was also previously offices for Without Walls. The library and lounge

features a beautiful stone fireplace, comfortable furniture and an extensive collection of books that residents can borrow.

The McKinnons, for which the space is named, were lifelong Pittsburgh residents who relocated to Greenville in retirement. Russ was an engineer at Westinghouse Electric Corp for 43 years, and Margaret was a homemaker. They were also active members of the First Presbyterian Church in Greenville.

Like Gerry and Frank, they also lived at St. Paul's but at sister facility The Ridgewood at Shenango

Valley in Hermitage. At the time that they needed care, St. Paul's in Greenville was full with a waiting list.

"They were very happy there," said Gerry. Even after Margaret had passed away in 2004 and there was an opening in Greenville, Russ opted to stay in the Valley because he was comfortable there, surrounded by friends.

It seems fitting that these two rooms will be used by residents at The Colony to grow and maintain their own friendships for many years to come.

A very special thank you to Archie & Ellen Wallace, Margie Hays and Gerry McElree for their generous gifts that helped make these beautiful spaces possible!

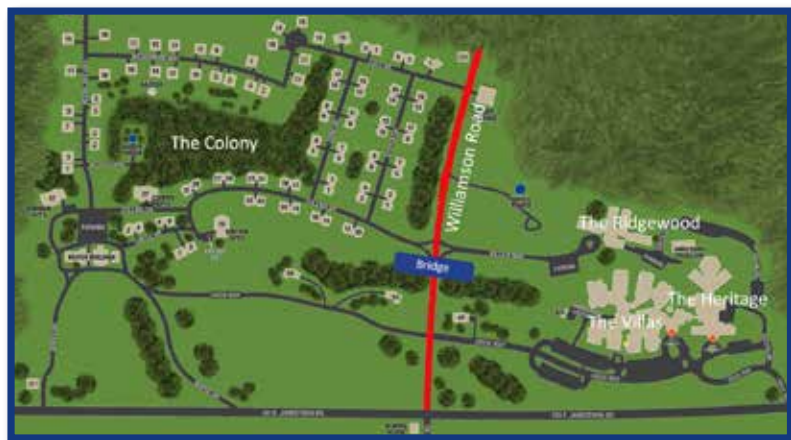


In July 2022 St. Paul's quietly launched the "Bridging the Gap" capital campaign with a goal to raise \$1.5 million to construct a pedestrian bridge over Williamson Road and a series of walking trails to connect the north and south sides of St. Paul's campus.

The bridge will be multi-use to accommodate walkers, bicyclists, motorized scooters and wheelchairs, golf carts and similar vehicles.

By the end of 2022 just over \$700,000 had been pledged for the project from St. Paul's board members, St. Paul's management team and a small group of major donors.

The campaign became public in January 2023 and solicitation of a wider audience will continue through the end of the year.

A Life Worth Living

At St. Paul's we believe there are seven building blocks that help our residents achieve wellbeing. These are what the Eden Alternative care philosophy calls the Seven Domains of Wellbeing—Identity, Connectedness, Security, Autonomy, Meaning, Growth and Joy.

The important work that St. Paul's volunteers do directly impacts these areas.

Volunteers develop personal relationships with residents, which are key to helping a resident feel cared about and safe (Security), feeling like an individual who is respected and known (Identity), and being connected to others in friendship and purpose (Connectedness). Volunteers also provide opportunities for residents to learn new things (Growth), as well as to share their own wisdom, skills and experiences with others (Meaning).

Volunteers help residents to maintain their independence (Autonomy) by being the helping hands and feet that get them where they want to go, whether it's outside to enjoy a beautiful day or to church on Sunday morning.

If you want to see Joy, check out when one of our volunteer pets are visiting, or there's a lively game of seated volleyball going on.

"Great volunteers build a life worth living for our residents," said Director of Volunteer Services Wendy Vaughn. "And at the same time, they build a life worth living for themselves too." What volunteer Margie Hays really likes about volunteering is the incredible relationships she builds with others. "There is so much knowledge and wisdom [the residents and their families] have to share," said Margie. "The interaction just blesses me. It helps build you up as a human being. It causes you to truly live."

If 2021 was a year of reawakening after the pandemic completely halted the volunteer program, 2022 was a year of building up from our new foundation.

We were able to recruit more volunteers and get them directly involved in building life at St. Paul's.

While volunteers still perform crucial duties like transporting residents, they also use their personal skills and interests to provide musical entertainment, game playing, educational programs, and arts and crafts.

We are always looking for new volunteers who would like to help build life at St. Paul's. Individuals of all ages can volunteer. We welcome school, community and church groups too.

Whether you only have an hour to share, or you'd like to serve more regularly, there is a volunteer opportunity for you at St. Paul's.

"We are particularly in need of individuals who can push wheelchairs right now," said Wendy. "These volunteers help transport residents to the fitness center, the beauty shop and other activities." There are morning and afternoon hours available for volunteers who transport residents.

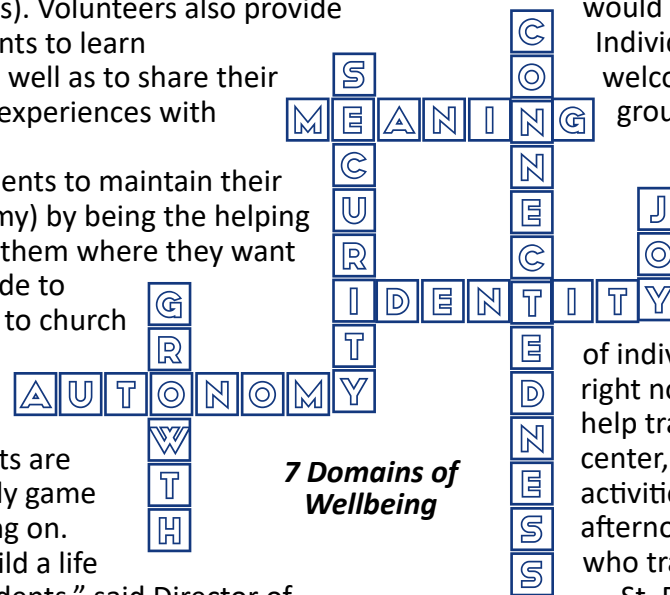

Ways to Give

At St. Paul's we are able to carry out our charitable mission every day because there are generous donors who invest their financial resources as building blocks for our success. If St. Paul's has made a difference in your life, please consider giving back so someone else in need can experience the same in the future. Here are a few of the ways you can give.

Outright Gift

Make an outright gift of cash or a check made payable to St. Paul's.

Credit Card Donation

Donate using a credit card on our website at www.stpauls1867.org or by calling the Charitable Giving Office at 724-589-4611.

Text to Give

Donate on the go by using your cell phone to text-to-give. Simply text the word SPGIVE to 44-321. Follow the simple steps to complete your gift.

Recurring Donation

If you'd like to donate regularly, you can set up a recurring weekly, monthly or quarterly donation quickly on St. Paul's website or by calling the Charitable Giving Office at 724-589-4611. Once you set it up, you don't have to think about it again!

Stocks, Bonds or Mutual Funds

Gifts of stocks, bonds or mutual funds can be transferred directly to St. Paul's. You will receive an immediate charitable deduction for the fair market value and won't have to pay capital gains tax!

Retirement Funds

If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can make gifts directly from your IRA to St. Paul's. This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution. You'll be donating money that has never been taxed, completely tax-free. You can make gifts up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity annually.

Corporate Matching Gifts

Ask your employer if they match charitable gifts made by employees. Many large employers like Google, Verizon and First Energy do this, potentially doubling your donation.

Donor Advised Funds

St. Paul's welcomes charitable gifts from donor advised funds. You make your tax deductible donations to your donor advised fund, and then you can choose which charities, like St. Paul's, receive support from your fund.

Ways to Give WITHOUT Spending Any Money

Facebook or Instagram Birthday Fundraiser – Don't need or want any gifts this year? Encourage friends and family to donate in your honor to St. Paul's instead by setting up a Facebook or Instagram Fundraiser.

PLANNED GIFTS

You can become a member of the Legacy Society by including a legacy gift for St. Paul's in your estate planning. Here are the most common ways to make a planned gift:

BEQUEST

Donate a set dollar amount or percentage to St. Paul's in your will or trust agreement.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

Set up a charitable gift annuity with a gift of \$10,000 or more. It will pay you an income for life and then the remainder will benefit St. Paul's.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUST

Set up a remainder trust with a gift of at least \$100,000. The trust will provide you (or a beneficiary) with income for life or a set number of years. The remaining principal will then go to St. Paul's.

LIFE INSURANCE

Gift a paid up policy you no longer need, or name St. Paul's as a beneficiary of your policy.

RETIREMENT PLAN

Name St. Paul's as a beneficiary of all or a portion of a retirement account. IRAs are the most heavily taxed asset to leave your heirs. Many donors choose to designate other assets for their heirs and make a charitable gift with their IRA instead.

Sharing God's Gifts

Rev. Dr. Ray & Mrs. Pat Brugler lived a life of service to God and to their fellow man. That's why it's not surprising that they made provisions in their estate plan to continue that service through legacy gifts for St. Paul's, where they ministered and made their home for more than 20 years.

Ray & Pat were both originally from Lewistown, Pa., where they met and got married in 1950. They had two children Ray Brugler Jr., who now lives in Millerstown, Pa., and Ruth Ann Fox, who lives in Chesapeake, Va.

The Bruglers celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary shortly before Ray passed away in December 2020.

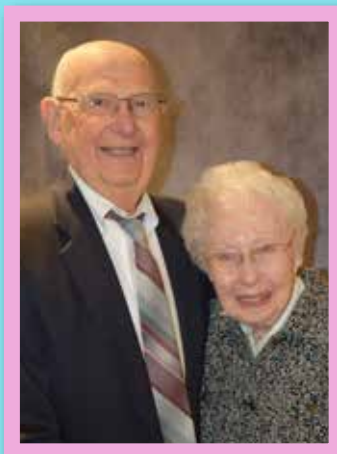
Ray was ordained for ministry in the Presbyterian Church in 1956, and together he and Pat served in active ministry for 38 years at churches in Newell, W.Va.; Avon Lake, Ohio; and Greensburg, Pa.

Pat had an associate's degree in business administration and worked as an administrative assistant. She was also an ordained ruling elder in the Presbyterian Church.

After retiring in 1993, the Bruglers came to Greenville, where Ray served as an interim pastor of the Bessemer, Unity and Sheakleyville churches and as a Parish Associate at Hillside Presbyterian Church.

In 1999, they made the decision to move to The Colony at St. Paul's. For many years they were actively involved in campus activities, volunteering and spiritual ministry, before moving to The Heritage in 2018.

Ray & Pat were also committed donors to St. Paul's, supporting the Good Samaritan Fund for benevolent care and the Resident Christmas Appeal faithfully each year. They were quick to honor a St. Paul's friend

or neighbor who passed away by making a charitable donation in their memory.

In 2011, Ray & Pat were generous donors to the Keeping the Promise campaign, which created a long term investment fund at St. Paul's to support benevolent care.

"St. Paul's long history of care – first for orphaned children and now for elders – influenced not only our choice of retirement homes, but also our decision to support the [Keeping the Promise Fund]," said the Bruglers at the time.

In 2012 they began using their IRA to make sizable gifts to St. Paul's each fall.

Individuals who are 70 1/2 years of age or older can make a qualified charitable distribution, also known as an IRA charitable rollover, each year from their IRA directly to a charity like St. Paul's.

"Giving away a portion of our income has been a life-long practice," said Ray when asked about his IRA giving in the past. "The biblical challenge to care for others is deeply embedded in our faith. Sharing God's gifts to us is an important aspect of good stewardship."

That is something the Bruglers wanted to continue after their lifetime. They began making provisions for their legacy giving in 2005 when they asked the Charitable Giving Office to set up their first charitable gift annuity to benefit St. Paul's. They followed suit with a second charitable gift annuity in 2010.

These annuities provided the Bruglers with a steady source of income for the remainder of their lives. After Pat passed away at the end of 2021, the remaining funds were donated to St. Paul's to be used wherever needed the most.

Earlier in 2021, Pat had added a third legacy gift to her estate plan by naming St. Paul's as the sole beneficiary of her IRA. That gift arrived in January 2022 and was allocated to the Keeping the Promise Fund, which the Bruglers had so generously supported in the past.

We are so grateful to residents like the Bruglers, whose lives were positively impacted by St. Paul's and who chose to share God's blessings so that others in need can be helped in the future.

Frank passed away at The Villas in 2010 after a courageous battle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Adele enthusiastically participated in life at St. Paul's, volunteering for many years in the gift shop, cooking and

baking for her fellow residents at The Ridgewood, and assisting with fundraising efforts for St. Paul's team in the Alzheimer's Association Memory Walk each year. She was a ray of sunshine to all who knew her.

Upon Adele's passing in 2022, her family designated memorial donations to go to St. Paul's because of the excellent care she received.

Adele loved her home at St. Paul's, but the thing she loved most in this world was her family.

Frank and Adele had five children, Michael, Rev. Frank (deceased), Leanne, Paul and Adam. She had nine grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

"Some of the things she loved about St. Paul's was being able to work in the vegetable garden, growing all kinds of things to bake or to share with friends and staff," said her son Michael. "She loved being able to use the staff kitchen to bake and make soups."

She also appreciated that St. Paul's staff helped her stay active. "Because she was so young at heart, she loved that the staff at St. Paul's worked to give her the

As part of Pennsylvania's PEER program, Adele was trained to self advocate and empower her fellow residents to improve their quality of life and quality of care. It brought her great joy to help others.

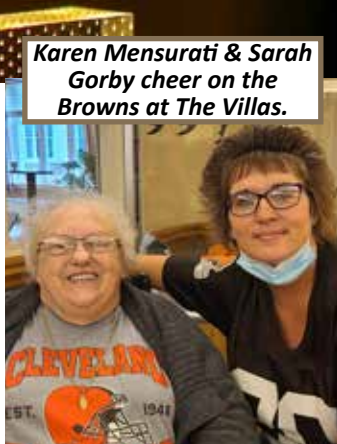
