EVERGREENS (Bundles of 25 = \$25.00)

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*)**18-24"**

Fast-growing, hardy evergreen known for its dark green needles, pyramidal form, and graceful, drooping branchlets. Commonly used for windbreaks, screening, and reforestation. Adapts well to a variety of soils. Popular ornamental and Christmas tree choice. 40 to 60' tall, 25-30' wide.

Concolor Fir (*Abies concolor*)**10-15"**

Slow-growing, conical evergreen with soft, silvery-blue needles and pleasant citrus scent. Withstands heat, drought, and cold. Prefers deep, rich, moist, well-drained gravelly or sandy-loam soils; dislikes heavy clay. Attractive choice for landscapes and Christmas trees. 30 to 50' tall, 15 to 20' wide.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii* var. *glauca*) 18-24"

Moderate-growing evergreen with spire-like growth habit. Needles are soft textured and more blue-green than the species. Prefers neutral or slightly acid, well-drained, moist soils. Excellent specimen or Christmas tree. Not suitable for windbreaks. 40 to 60' tall, 12 to 20' wide.

White Spruce (*Picea glauca*)**10-18"**

Moderate-growing evergreen with a densely pyramidal, compact form and blue-green needles. One of the most tolerant spruces to wind, heat, cold, drought, and crowding. Tolerant of light shade. Useful as a specimen or windbreak and makes an excellent Christmas tree. 40 to 60' tall, 10 to 20' wide.

Scotch Pine (*Pinus sylvestris*)**10-16"**

Moderate-growing evergreen having irregular, pyramidal growth when young. Often flat-topped or umbrella-shaped when mature. Blue-green needles occur in clusters of two. Extremely adaptable to varied soils, particularly poor, dry sites. Useful in mass or as Christmas trees. 30 to 60' tall, 30 to 40' wide.

TREES AND FLOWERING SHRUBS

Winterberry Holly (*Ilex verticillata*)**\$3.50 ea.****18-30"**

Slow to moderate-growing deciduous shrub holly. Female plants produce showy, bright red berries. Likes acidic soil and tolerates wet, swampy conditions. Plants are grown from seed, so male and female plants cannot be distinguished. Therefore, plant at least 5 to ensure pollination. 6 to 10' tall and wide.

Osage-Orange (*Maclura pomifera*)**\$3.50 ea.****15-30"**

Fast-growing tree with low, rounded, irregular crown. Distinguished for its yellow-green, orange-shaped inedible fruit. Wood is rot resistant. Often used for windbreaks or fence rows, due to its fast, dense growth and heavy thorns, which make an impenetrable barrier against people and livestock. Tolerant of all types of sites. 20 to 40' tall and wide.

River Birch (*Betula nigra*)**\$3.50 ea.****24-36"**

Fast-growing tree, pyramidal in youth and oval/rounded at maturity. Interesting bark is variable, usually dark gray-brown and scaly, but can be smooth and creamy pinkish-white exfoliating in curly papery sheets. Excellent tree for low, swampy areas. Immune to Bronze Birch Borer. Extremely heat tolerant. 40 to 60' tall and wide.

Swamp White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*)**\$3.50 ea.****18-24"**

Moderate-growing tree with a broad, rounded crown. Thrives in moist to wet, deep soils, often along streams, ponds, and lowlands – but is very adaptable. Excellent shade tree and important food source for wildlife. Attractive bark, glossy green leaves, and strong form makes it an attractive landscape tree. Great for riparian plantings and reforestation efforts. 60 to 70' tall, equal spread.

Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*) \$3.50 ea. 18-24"

Fast-growing tree with pyramidal to oval-rounded form, straight trunk, glossy green leaves, and showy tulip-like flowers. Excellent landscape tree. Very useful for reforestation due to its timber and wildlife quality. Thrives in deep, moist, well-drained loam but is adaptable. 80 to 100' tall, 35 to 50' wide.

Bur Oak (*Quercus macrocarpa*)**\$3.50 ea.****18-24"**

Slow to moderate-growing, long-lived oak known for massive trunks, broad-spreading crowns, and distinctive large-fringed acorns. Highly adaptable to wide range of soils, from dry uplands to clay conditions. Excellent shade tree and valuable habitat and food for wildlife. White oak family member. 70 to 80' tall, equal or wider spread.

White Flowering Dogwood (*Cornus florida*) \$3.50 ea. 12-18"

Slow to moderate-growing tree celebrated for its clusters of white showy bracts in early spring and vibrant red fall foliage. Small, red berries provide valuable food for wildlife. Prefers well-drained soils in partial shade. Protect from harsh winter winds. 20 to 30' tall, equal spread.

Hackberry (*Celtis occidentalis*) \$3.50 ea. 18-24"

Moderate to fast-growing tree. Tough and adaptable thriving in a wide range of soils and conditions. Attractive and unique corky, warty bark with a broad, rounded crown. Tolerates drought, wind, and urban conditions, making an excellent choice for street, yard, or restoration plantings. Fruits relished by birds and wildlife. 40 to 60' tall, nearly equal spread.

OTHER

Red Rhubarb \$7.00 ea.

Victoria Root - Heirloom variety. Slender red/green stalks can be harvested after the first year. Excellent for cooking and baking.

Horseradish Root \$5.00 ea. Root

Can be grown in a container.

Asparagus Root 5/\$8.00

Jersey Supreme - Early season, high yield, cold hardy, disease resistance.

POTTED PLANTS

Lynwood Gold Forsythia (*Forsythia x intermedia 'Lynwood Gold'*) \$5.00 ea.

Very fast, upright-arching shrub. One of the best plants for fast flowering screen. Deep golden flowers, early spring, more thickly and evenly distributed along the stems than other Forsythia. Ordinary to poor soil tolerant. Plant in full sun. For hedge, plant 4 to 5 feet apart. 8 to 10' tall, 10 to 12' wide.

Black Eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia fulgida 'Goldsturm'*) \$5.00 ea.

Perennial. Bright golden flowers, July into fall. Easily reseeds. Tolerates light shade. Spectacular in mass plantings. 2 to 2 1/2' tall, spread variable.

Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*) \$5.00 ea.

Perennial. Large, daisy-like flowers on sturdy stems. Blooms all summer and into autumn. Plant in full sun or partial shade. 24 to 36" tall, 12 to 18" wide.

Grass, Blue Fescue (*Festuca glauca 'Elijah Blue'*) \$5.00 ea.

Perennial, semi-evergreen grass with striking blue-gray leaves. Tolerates dry, poor soils; dislikes wet soil. Divide every 2 to 3 years. 1 to 2' tall and wide.

Pawpaw (*Asimina triloba*) \$8.00 ea.

Moderate growing, multi-stemmed shrub or small tree known for its large tropical-looking leaves and unique, sweet-flavored edible fruit. Thrives in rich, moist soils and partial shade. Excellent for forest interior or edge plantings, even landscapes. Supports native pollinators. Harvest time mid-August to mid-October. Plant at least two trees for fruit production to ensure cross pollination. 15 to 20' tall and wide.

White Fringetree (*Chionanthus virginicus*) \$8.00 ea.

Slow-growing large shrub or small tree with spreading, open habit. Slightly fragrant, creamy white, fine-textured showy flowers appear in late spring. Glossy-green foliage. Showy blue-black fruits mature in late summer. Excellent specimen or landscape plant that needs little pruning. Prefers deep, moist, acidic soil but is very adaptable. Good food source for birds and wildlife. 12 to 20' tall and wide.

American Common Persimmon (*Diospyros virginiana*) \$8.00 ea.

Moderate-growing tree with pyramidal to open habit. Dark green leaves turn reddish-purple in fall. Blocky, interesting bark with maturity. Fragrant, white, blueberry-shaped flowers in late spring are a favorite of honeybees. Edible fruit ripens with a deep orange color after several frosts. Prefers moist, well-drained, sandy soils but does well in low-fertility dry soils. Requires another tree for pollination. Exceptional wildlife value. 35 to 60' tall, 20 to 35' spread.

Planting survival rates of bare-root seedlings vary from site to site, from excellent to poor. We strive to provide the most viable seedlings. All efforts are made to prevent root stress. The conservation district will NOT ensure successful planting of bare-root seedlings, just as our suppliers will not ensure seedling survival.
