Progress on Grant Initiatives

Psychostimulant Grant (2022-2025)

- First session of **Matrix Model Training** completed for substance use treatment staff in our grant area February session scheduled
 - Purchasing materials for all participating agencies
- Compassion Fatigue training = 99 attendees
- Upcoming session 2/10/23: Differential Diagnosis with Complaints of Attention Problems by Lisa May, Ph.D.

Psychostimulant Grant Focus Groups

Listening sessions to assess healthcare disparity – feedback from all 3 counties = themes on the following barriers:

- Socioeconomic; emphasis on housing and unemployment
 - Childcare
 - Transportation
- Criminal justice, transition from incarceration
- Stigma fear of seeking treatment
- Prescription drug prescribing practices

Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) Prevention Grant update

WRC Staff: Amy Weaver and Samantha Hartle

- Women's Recovery Center (WRC) co-located at OB/Gyn practice in Franklin
 - Counseling and Medication for OUD
 - Successfully serving 12 women (20 children)
 - 3 babies born in 2022 (total 8 since 2021) none needed medicine for withdrawal
 - 3 pregnant women currently
 - All babies were home with family for holidays
 - Sober/social events served 500+ people in Venango County
 - Skating, movie license for public movie nights, library events



Updates and Progress:

- Hosted **National Rural Health Day** at Cranberry Mall (Seneca) with 20 partner agencies providing resources for the community networking
- Scheduled upcoming training with municipal police academy, and groups in the jail
- Planning events in all 3 counties for **National Drug Take Back Day** in April education about proper disposal of unused medication overdose prevention
- Hosted focus groups/listening sessions to gather insights on health disparities in our rural area – contributing to our **Disparities Impact Statement** to identify and address barriers to treatment and recovery

Recovery Is Community NWPA Grant Consortium members work together to:

- Increase access to counseling and medication for opioid use disorder
- Distribute lifesaving naloxone (Narcan®) for opioid overdose reversal
- Promote safe disposal of prescription medications with drug deactivation/disposal kits
- Improve access to substance use services for pregnant and parenting women

Continuing Education and Training

We offer online and in-person training sessions, focused on:

- Reducing stigma and promoting compassionate care
- Reviewing substance use screening tools and treatment referral options
- Improving awareness of compassion fatigue and the importance of self-care
- Assessing appropriate treatment modalities for those struggling with substance use
