And it does, because you are here.

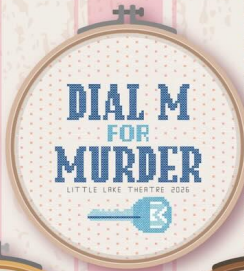
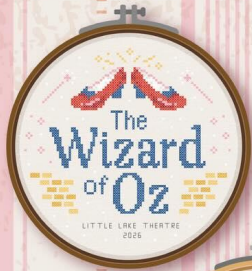

Patti worked for 15 years with Pittsburgh Musical Theater as their Marketing & Development Manager while overseeing numerous educational programs reaching over 268 students ages 4-18, as well as maintaining the company's database. She was instrumental in formulating a successful \$3-million-dollar capital campaign, which resulted in Pittsburgh Musical Theater purchasing the building that has housed them for over 12 years. She has worked as a consultant to other nonprofits, assisting with grant writing, marketing, and implementing accessibility initiatives in the Pittsburgh area. Patrick Cannon (Artistic Director) is in his fifth season as Artistic Director of Little Lake Theatre Company, where he has led the organization to record-breaking growth in subscriptions, attendance, and revenue while expanding its artistic programming and community reach. Cannon is a multidisciplinary artist working as a director, writer, and Actors' Equity Association actor. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre from Columbia College Chicago and a Master of Fine Arts in Screenwriting and Playwriting from Point Park University. His film projects Submit it to Festivals, Mulligan, and We Are Nowhere have been Official Selections in five Academy Award qualifying film festivals. Mulligan (available on Amazon) won Best Pilot at the Rhode Island International Film Festival and was one of three pilots selected worldwide for Film Independent's LA Film Festival. He is also the recipient of the BroadwayWorld Pittsburgh Award for Best Direction of a Musical for Amélie. 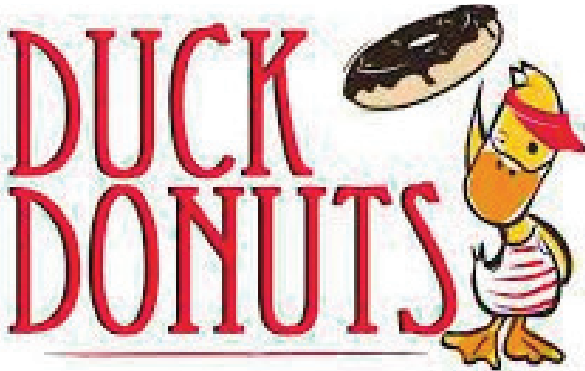
