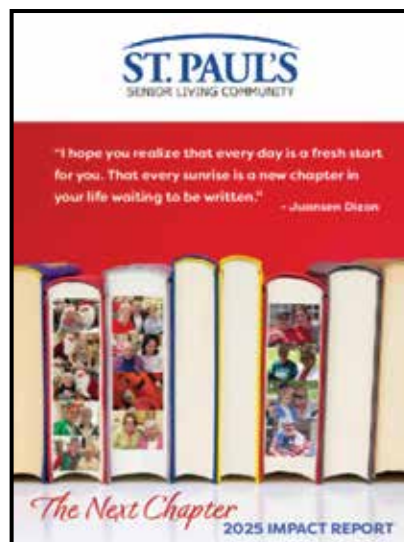

## Policy on gifts and gratuities

While residents, clients and family members often wish to show their appreciation for the care and services rendered by St. Paul's staff, St. Paul's must ensure that residents, clients and family members do not feel obligated to give St. Paul's or its staff gifts or gratuities in order to assure a resident or client receives quality care. In order to comply with this policy St. Paul's has set forth the following guidelines:

1. Employees may not ask or suggest that a resident or client, or any person acting on behalf of a resident or client should offer or give gifts or gratuities to St. Paul's staff.
2. Employees may not accept cash or currency of any kind, including but not limited to tips from any source or individual. Employee bonuses and/or gifts provided by St. Paul's do not constitute gifts or gratuities.
3. Employees may only accept non-cash gifts that do not exceed \$10.00, and/or are shared by the whole staff. In order to be considered a non-cash gift, the gift cannot be converted to currency.

## Opportunities for Gifts of Appreciation to Staff

Many residents, clients and families often ask how they can give back and say "Thank You" to the staff who have provided excellent care to their loved ones while living at St. Paul's. These two funds give you the opportunity to do so:

1. A donation may be made to the Staff Appreciation Fund. This fund enables St. Paul's to recognize all staff. (i.e., to provide staff apparel, staff appreciation picnics, or gift cards for various occasions.)
2. A donation can be made to the Staff Education Fund. This fund helps St. Paul's offer various educational opportunities to grow and develop team members' skills

If you would like to make a donation to staff for anything outside of these two funds, please see your administrator or director to talk about specifics.

***Employees may not accept individual gifts, cash or currency of any kind from a resident or family member. We appreciate your support of these guidelines in order for us to remain compliant with regulations and our corporate compliance policies.***

# Spiritual Services

## A Message from Chaplain Pat

The cyclic nature of life is the cycle of birth, life, death and rebirth. If we take the time—especially now with the warmer days that have cropped up giving us hope that winter is almost over—to look around us we can see that cycle already in motion. The grass is a bit greener, the hawk that flies above my house is courting a mate, the outer fuzzy covering on the deciduous magnolias are opening, trusting that it is time for the buds to be exposed, and the Lenten Roses would be blooming.



None of the folks who attend worship in-person knew about Lenten Roses. I've included a handy picture to try to win you over. I first learned about them when I attended seminary in Lancaster, Pa., and they also grew in several of the gardens at the previous community I served in Virginia.

They are an unobtrusive small plant that pushes its way through the snow and ice sometime in February. Its low, mounding shape is perfect for being unnoticed. Neither its leaves nor its eventual flowers are show-stopping beautiful. They don't draw too much attention to themselves, appearing content to work in the background of the garden. It's like they don't want to startle anyone with the bright spring beauty of say, forsythia, or magnolia that bloom before they leaf. They are strong though and persistent. They bloom during the Lenten Season, sometime during those forty days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, no matter how early on the calendar it seems to fall.

This year Easter falls on Sunday, April 5. The development of this small, ground covering bush is a way for us to see tangible signs of hope during this time of resonating with the suffering of Jesus leading to his death by crucifixion into the promise of resurrection. A reflection of one example of the cyclic nature of birth, life, death, and resurrection that are all around us. Perhaps by next year, we will have some of these persistently inspiring plants in our gardens, but until then God through nature has offered us other examples if we are curious enough to look for them. May you find wonder in your searching.

## Team Member Spotlight

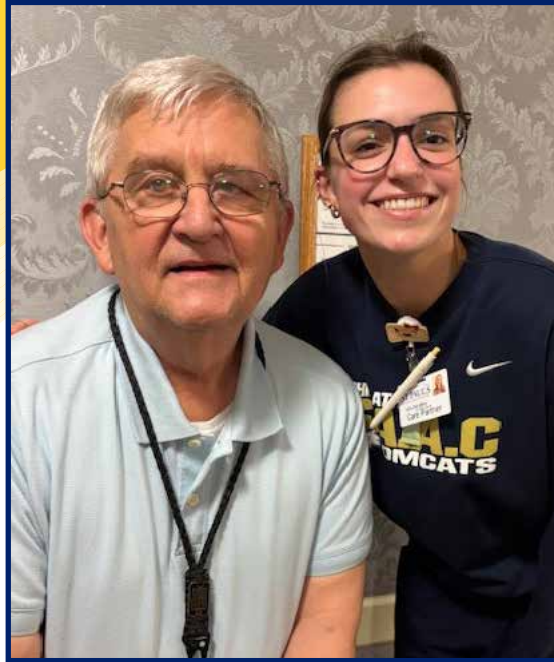

ways and making the most of my time with them,” she said. When others consider similar roles, Arin offers simple advice: “Do it! It will be the best part of your day—the clients are so appreciative.”



Currently in the first semester of her senior year in Thiel’s nursing program, Arin is completing her clinicals and plans to graduate in December. Her favorite part of clinicals is forming connections with patients and building trust. “I strive to make their hospital stay a little easier,” she said. While she especially enjoys medical-surgical nursing and the ICU, she remains open to the many paths nursing offers. Her short-term goals include passing her boards, beginning her career, and possibly pursuing graduate school.

Outside of work and school, Arin enjoys spending time with friends, watching movies—especially romantic comedies, and reading. She recently began exploring diamond art painting and loves spending time with her dog, Daisy, a beagle-dachshund mix. If given the chance to travel anywhere, Greece tops her list. “The scenery looks absolutely beautiful, and I want to try the food!” she said.
