WKS 4 & 5 // JULY 6 - 10 & JULY 13 - 17 ERIE HISTORY INVESTIGATORS

In this two week course, students will explore local historical sites and museums to uncover stories of struggle, sacrifice, and perseverance in our community. Through research and creative project development, they will transform what they discover about those who came before us into a public presentation that shares Erie's history with others. This is the second of four courses over the next year with a focus on history, that will culminate with a historical trip to Washington D.C. in the Spring of 2027. Students will be selected for this experience based on their participation in this, previous, and future historical courses.

GLOBAL LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

The Global Leadership Summit is an annual conference of world-

renowned leaders that is broadcast to hundreds of host sites across the United States and around the world. It is designed to develop leadership skills for people in business, nonprofit, church, education, and community organizations. Select Urban University students that demonstrate an exceptional level of leadership and maturity will have the opportunity to attend.

SHIP & SHORE WITH THE RSC

During this immersive experience, students will explore the

science of Lake Erie, from its shores and lagoons to its open waters. Students will sail aboard the historic Lettie G. Howard tall ship while collecting scientific data, then analyze their samples at the (RSC) Regional Science Consortium labs, testing for bacteria, identifying plankton species, and conducting microscopic analysis. Students will also study Lake Erie's rich maritime history, including its more than 200 recorded shipwrecks, and participate in activities used by shipwreck scientists such as trilateration and 3D modeling.

INTRO TO SCUBA DIVING

An introduction to the core principles of scuba diving, including dive equipment,

underwater communication, buoyancy control, descents, hand signals, and proper breathing techniques. Students build confidence above the surface on day 1, then suit up for guided pool dives on days 2 and 3 to practice skills in a controlled underwater environment.

SEWING & DENIM DESIGN

Beginner and advanced students will have the opportunity to learn and enhance their sewing machine skills as they uniquely design and create their choice of a body or throw pillow.

MARQUETRY WOOD ART

Learn the art of creating detailed images and patterns using carefully cut and assembled wood veneers. Students will learn design planning, precision cutting, layering techniques, and finishing methods while crafting their own decorative marquetry artwork.

DIORAMA 3D ART

This 3D visual art form combines elements of sculpture, modeling, and storytelling. Challenge your creativity using a variety of everyday materials to model, design, detail, and paint in the world of miniatures.

HOSPITALITY & CULINARY ARTS

Students will work alongside guest chefs to prepare, cook, and serve lunch. This will be fast-paced, and require students to exercise a strong and focused work ethic, multi-tasking, and teamwork.

PREREQUISITE: Must have previously taken a UU culinary course.

SESSION 2

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE & DEAF CULTURE

An introduction to ASL in an immersive environment where students learn through a variety of activities, basic conversation, narrative skills, interpreting music through sign, as well as experiences in understanding deaf culture.

CROCHET

Learn to crochet! Beginners will learn the basics and crochet an amigurumi project. Advanced students will be challenged to crochet projects at a higher level of difficulty.

Learn the science, techniques, and art of baking, and how to make a variety of desserts, cookies, and breads from scratch in a professional kitchen.
