



SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY

Every day caregivers at Ashtabula Regional Medical Center encounter patients facing challenges that require more than quality healthcare.

Many patients cannot afford necessary medications or supportive services that would improve their health and their quality of life. In addition, caregivers often encounter patients facing food insecurity. ARMC and ARMC Foundation have established two programs to assist those whose circumstances leave unmet the basic means to maintain a reasonable level of dignity, self-respect, and fundamental life needs beyond medical care.

The ARMC Foundation Patient Urgent Needs Program strives to provide for those essential needs that are not covered by any other form of assistance but will have a positive impact on the patient's well-being, outcome, and quality of life. Examples include: medical supplies or home medical equipment, co-pay assistance for medications/doctor visits, reasonable transportation to treatments or medical appointments, etc.

The ARMC Food & Clothes Pantry was founded by an interdisciplinary team of ARMC caregivers to provide emergency assistance to patients and caregivers facing food insecurity. While there are several food pantries in our community, many of our patients lack transportation to get to those locations, or it is obvious that they can't wait for the next time the food pantry is open – they need food today. Another consistent patient need is to replace clothing damaged during patient care. The ARMC Food & Clothes Pantry stocks non-perishable food items, toiletries, paper products and a limited amount of new clothing.

Volunteers, 16 years of age and over, serve in a number of capacities including: the Huffman-Mayer Wealth Management Gift Shop, outpatient registration, surgical waiting room, comfort runners on inpatient floors, spiritual care and the ARMC information desk. We work to match your goals and interests with opportunities. All volunteers must be able to commit to a minimum of two 4-hour shifts per month for at least 6 months during the year and complete an onboarding process including a background check. Volunteers under 18 must also provide a letter of recommendation from a teacher or guidance counselor and a vaccination record.
