Using drugs may alter judgment, lower inhibitions and can increase risky behaviors. Having unprotected sex, injecting drugs, or sharing “works” can **transmit infectious diseases like HIV, Hepatitis C, endocarditis, syphilis, and other sexually transmitted infections.**

Symptoms can go undetected, but may include:

- Fever
- Rash/itching
- Chills or night sweats
- Fatigue/muscle aches
- Hair Loss
- Jaundice (yellow discoloration of the skin and eyes)
- Easily bruising/bleeding
- Dark-colored urine, light-colored stools
- Abdominal pain/swelling
- Loss of appetite or weight loss
- Nausea/diarrhea
- Dark colored urine
- Sores or bumps on genitals, sometimes painless
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Sore throat/mouth ulcers
